## **Focus Areas**

#### **Global Business and Trade**

This area focuses on global trade and economic development, with studies in trade policy, macroeconomic policy, political and legal structures surrounding global trade. This focus area is appropriate for students wishing to enter careers in international business, government, public service, institutional development, consulting, trade development, policy analysis and economic development.

## **Public Diplomacy and Global Communication**

Global news organizations, emerging communication technologies, and the reconfiguration of social networks and ties have had a particularly potent impact on how we communicate internationally, so much so that governments are building capacity in public diplomacy in order to better manage the impact of media on international relations. This focus area is designed to help students develop skills and theory in public diplomacy so that they are better prepared for careers in government service, business, or other fields that require an understanding of the global communication environment.

#### **Global Leadership and Development**

This focus area addresses fundamental global challenges, and developing the skills that will enable students to be leaders in addressing humanitarian and social issues in diverse cultural settings. Depending on their interests, students may select courses that address: human rights, nutritional problems, health care human capital development, educational needs and occupational training. Students completing this area prepare for careers in international service agencies, humanitarian groups, educational and research institutions and consulting firms.

#### **Global Disaster and Crisis Management**

The Global Disaster and Crisis management focus area emphasizes global development through crisis management, such as natural disasters, political crisis, or social conflict. This track prepares students in government or non-profit organizations.

The MSGS program requires students to take 9-12 hours from a focus area. Choose 3-4 courses from one of the focus areas listed below.
