Affiliated and Approved Programs

What is an Affiliated Program?

Affiliated and Approved Exchange programs are coordinated by private study abroad organizations, a recognized university abroad, or another U.S. university. Credits earned with the host organization transfer back to OSU when you return from your program. Each provider offers different program locations and program types.

Special Benefits ?

Affiliated and Approved programs differ from traditional study abroad programs by structure, excursions, housing, networking events and more. Sometimes these events are included in the cost of the program.

How to Fund Your Trip\$

Most Affiliated and Approved programs, as well as OSU, offer numerous study abroad scholarships. Because you are not attending OSU, your tuition-based scholarships will be put on hold until your return, so apply early for scholarship consideration. Other funding is available through federal financial aid. To receive federal financial aid, you must take courses that apply toward your degree.

Eligibility & Deadlines 🗸

Students with a 2.5 GPA or above with at least 30 credit hours at the time of their trip can participate. Some exceptions for GPA can be made. Provider deadlines can differ, but you should apply at least six months before your intended departure date. Remember to apply through OSU Center for Global Learning as well.


