

OSU Global initiatives in Mexico for 2024

What is OSU Mexico?

OSU Mexico is the representation office based in UPAEP campus (Puebla City, Mexico) that facilitates, promotes, supports and seeks equitable and reciprocal initiatives that interest OSU's community to carry on with and in Mexico.

For 2024 our priority is increasing awareness of OSU in UPAEP through very concrete activities. This will be our grounding base for strengthening current collaboration, finding innovation space and building new areas of mutual interest.

In an effort to provide OSU community with a space for feedback regarding this initiatives, OSU Mexico will have **virtual orientation sessions each Wednesday from December 6 to February 28, from 12 to 1**. Please use this <u>link</u> to participate.

I. UPAEP Global Summer 2024

UPAEP's Vice Presidency of Outreach and International Affairs (VPOI) has opened a call to welcome faculty members from partner institutions to take part in the Global Summer program 2024.

As strategic partners, OSU Mexico will be supporting and promoting this call among our colleges and divisions with the following objectives:

- 1. To increase opportunities for OSU faculty to interact with colleagues and peers in their field of expertise in UPAEP.
- 2. To increase collaboration in existing and common areas of cooperation such as dual degrees.
- 3. To raise awareness of the various opportunities UPAEP offers to OSU faculty and students.
- 4. To cultivate and build a better understanding of Mexico and its importance for OSU and the USA long-term agenda.

UPAEP GLOBAL SUMMER 2024 DETAILS

- The UPAEP Global Summer will take place from Monday, June 17th, to Friday, July 12th, 2024. Selected faculty should arrive in Mexico before June 17th and leave after July 12th.
- Depending on their area of expertise, international faculty <u>may select up to two courses</u> (from the relevant courses to the disciplinary area of expertise) to be considered.
- The course will be taught in person and intensively for four weeks from June 17th to July 12th, 2024, in a classroom and at times scheduled by the respective UPAEP Dean's Office.
- The courses will be taught at UPAEP main campus (located in the city of Puebla, Mexico) in designated classrooms and/or laboratories.

APPLICATION

The application process will be open from **November 30, 2023, until January 17, 2024.** Interested faculty should complete <u>this form</u> and submit along with the following:

- Provide detailed reasons about the interest in taking part of UPAEP's Global Summer 2024.
- Updated curriculum Vitae/Resumé.
- Demonstrate expertise in the subject matter of the selected lectures through equivalent disciplinary training.
- Provide the results from the most recent teaching evaluation at Oklahoma State University.
- Proof of doctoral degree.
- Provide evidence of research or extension activities, including ongoing research, publications, outreach activities, business consulting, or other relevant activities.
- Willingness to participate in parallel agendas, which may include additional activities beyond teaching such as: interviews with local media, conferences or workshops for the university community as well as with social, business, or governmental sectors. Colloquia with UPAEP researchers, summer academies for UPAEP School System (middle and high schools), among others.
- Faculty should specify in the application form if expertise in any of the following active teaching methodologies is part of their profile. An invitation to participate in a collaboration project to plan faculty development activities at UPAEP will be part of the program. The active methodologies to consider include:
 - Problem-Based Learning
 - Challenge-Based Learning
 - Service Learning
 - Case Method or Case Studies
 - Research-Based Learning
 - Relationship-Based Learning
 - Simulation-Based Learning
 - Team-Based Learning
 - Action Research

Closing date for applications: January 17th, 2024.

Please have in mind only complete and timely applications will be considered.

SELECTION PROCESS AND ACCEPTANCE REQUIREMENTS

- After the call's closing date, the selection process will take place **between January and February 2024** and will be carried out by an Evaluation Committee. Faculty selected will receive an Invitation Letter from the Vice Presidency of Outreach and International Affairs at UPAEP during the first half of March.
- If the selected faculty accepts the invitation, a request to provide personal documents for international travel arrangements to Mexico, accommodation, and registration as a visiting professor in the UPAEP system will be sent.
- Between April and May, virtual sessions will be held. There, selected faculty and representatives of the relevant Dean's Office at UPAEP will participate. These sessions will guide the teaching schedule, the functioning of UPAEP's virtual platforms, a review of the Learning Guide (equivalent to the "syllabus" in other institutions), the assessment method applied at UPAEP, and the activities that the international faculty may be invited to participate in as part of parallel agendas.
- Before arriving in Mexico, faculty must submit a digitized copy of their international medical insurance (in English if that is the case). This must at least cover accidents, civil responsibility, illness, and repatriation.

PROGRAM BENEFITS

- Invitation letter to each selected faculty.
- Accommodation in a location near the UPAEP, in a single room.
- Round-trip transportation expenses from the home country to Puebla City.
- Three meals a day during the program.
- Cultural daytrips in and outside Puebla City.
- Parallel agenda with the respective UPAEP Dean's Office and other outreach units.
- A shared workspace with all necessary services and supplies to work during the program.
- Host Dean's Office in charge of the disciplinary area support.
- Upon completion of the program, a Certificate of Attendance will be issued.

*Please note that expenses not covered by this call will be the responsibility of the selected OSU faculty.

Dates and format

The USA-Mexico Series will take place **from February and December 2024** (without the summer months and August) as preparation to Mexico's week (September or November TBC).

Each month 2 faculty members from OSU will lead a virtual activity linked to a topic of interest for both countries. Activities type can include, but are not limited to:

- ✓ Virtual workshops
- ✓ Book presentation
- ✓ Movie presentation/analysis

Dates will be coordinated with interested Faculty members to build a calendar, review any request to carry on with the activities, as well as promoting them.

All activities will be virtual, open to both OSU and UPAEP communities. The virtual platform will be Zoom and, when appropriate, the activities will be hosted in a conference room in UPAEP campus (e.g., a workshop)

Estimated dates: Mid-February to mid-December 2024, without activities from June to August.

- 4. Special implementation requests to carry on with the activity virtually
- 5. SDG's faculty expect to impact through this activity
- 6. For colleges involved in dual degrees with UPAEP, expected related outcomes
